Dear Parents/Guardians: We are still in a very cautious time due to Covid-19. This is our 27th year to provide free art, music, dance, environmental, classes to youth 7-18. Class size is <u>extremely</u> limited since we are conforming to the Health Department and CDC 6-foot social distancing rules. Everyone must wear a mask inside the Art House for everyone's safety.

Our classes are filled on a first come basis.

Besides the parent agreement form <u>you must fill out the new COVID form for your child to attend the Art House</u>. When your child is registered you will receive an email telling you that your child has been accepted. If for any reason your child cannot attend, please contact us immediately so that we can admit another child to the program.
