FOCUS ON HAND-SEWING

Sewing Pillows, taught by Cathy Miller, is often among the first classes that a child takes at the Art House. It won't be an ordinary pillow that these boys and girls make, but one with a quilt-patch top made by stitching all the pieces together, then stuffing it with polyester fiberfill. The stitching-it's all done BY HAND!

Cathy Miller has been an Art House teacher since the program began with a pilot in the summer of 1994. She developed the pillow project early on, and since then has guided the fingers of nearly 2,000 children to "keep the stitches small" and "match the edges carefully." Cathy is quick to tell visitors that she learned long ago that many of the Art House families cannot provide pillows for their children. "The children are very proud to make one of their very own, to take it home to show their parents and to use it as their very own bed pillow"

After this pillow project, the children are welcome to sign up for additional quilting classes where they not only expand the size of their quilted item, but develop ever more complex hand-sewing, measuring and design skills.
